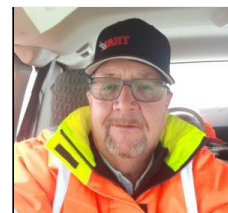

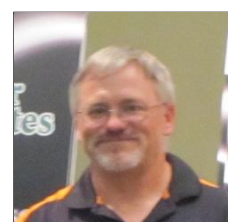

Historical Hotel Wolf:

The Historical Hotel Wolf opened its doors on New Years Eve in 1893 with a gala masquerade ball. Over its lifetime, The Wolf has served as a stop on the Stage line, a barber shop, a guide/outfitter service, a drive through liquor store and an art gallery. It has also played home to many visiting celebrities. The Wolf Hotel is on the National Register of Historic Places. Today the Hotel Wolf has been restored and looks much as it did in 1893.

Hotel Wolf is providing catering for the entire WSWRA Event. This is a great opportunity to experience some great food with a hometown feel! All of the food served at our event will be provided by Hotel Wolf. Be sure to catch a meal on your own time and see this great historic site during your stay in Saratoga!

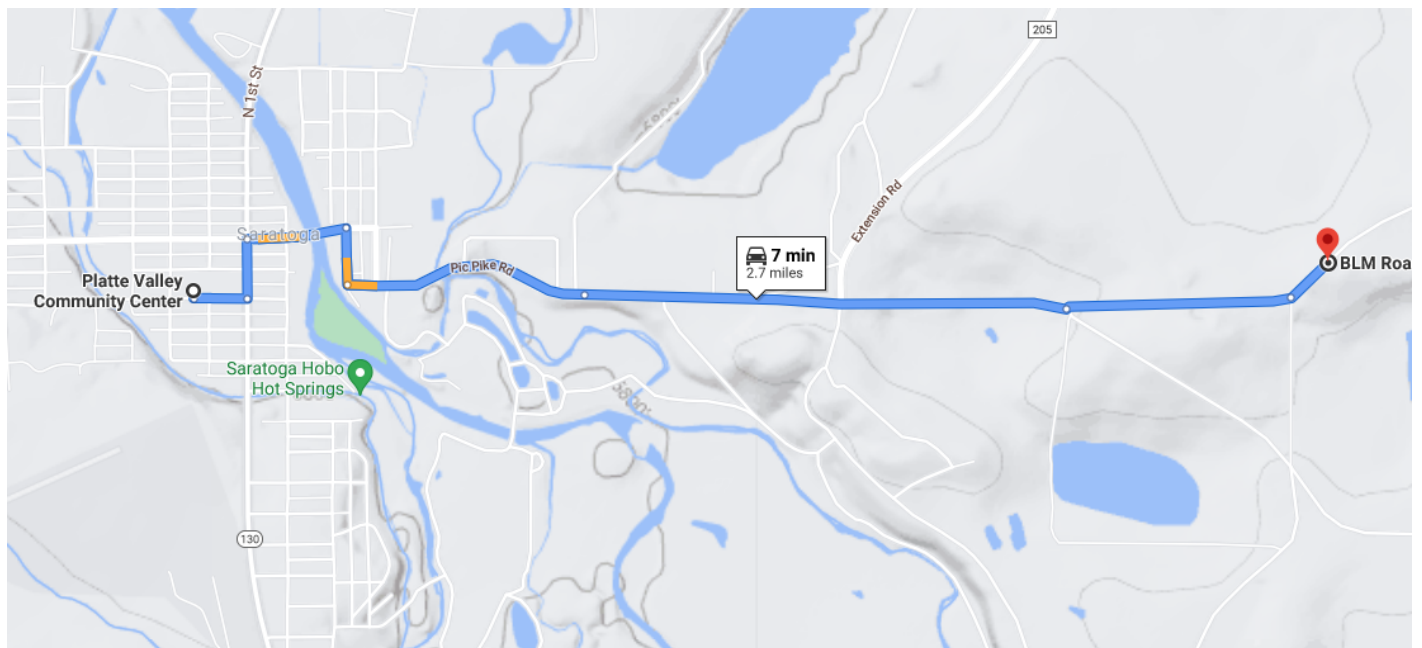

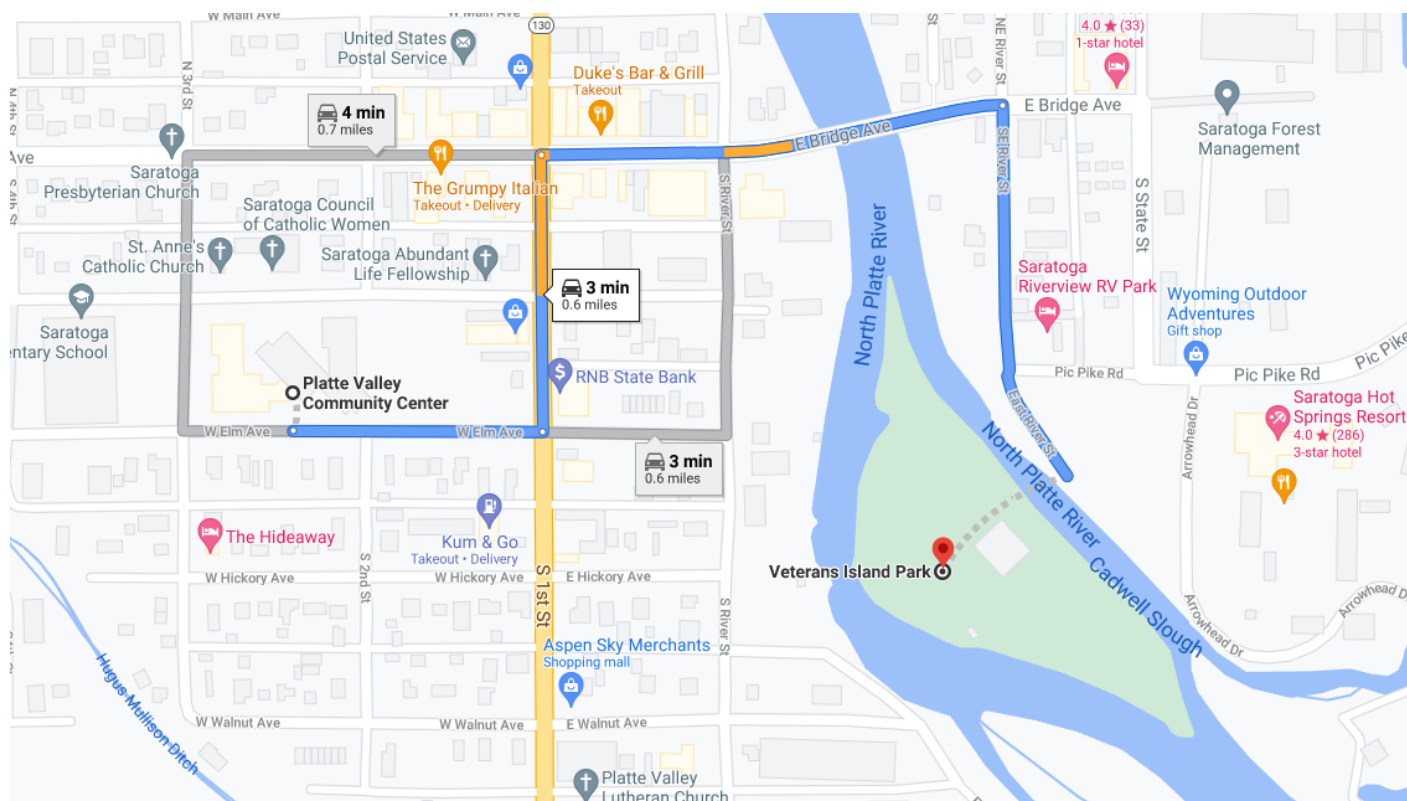
Directions to Saratoga Landfill:

From the Platte Valley Community Center cross the river at Bridge Street and take the first Right. The road will bend and turn into Pic Pike Road. Continue to head East about 2 miles and pass the Golf Course at Mt Baldy. Shortly after the golf course look for a small fork in the road and sign that says landfill to the left. Continue down the dirt road and the landfill gate is shortly ahead. Continue on to the landfill property and park by the transfer station and scales.



Directions to Veterans Island Park:

Cross the North Platte River Via the bridge on Bridge Street. Take the first Right. Follow the road down to Pic Pike Road. Keep straight and do not turn at Pic Pike Road, and continue onto the dirt road ahead. The area ahead is the parking area for the Park, please park your vehicle here. There is a pedestrian crossing over the river to cross over to the Park.

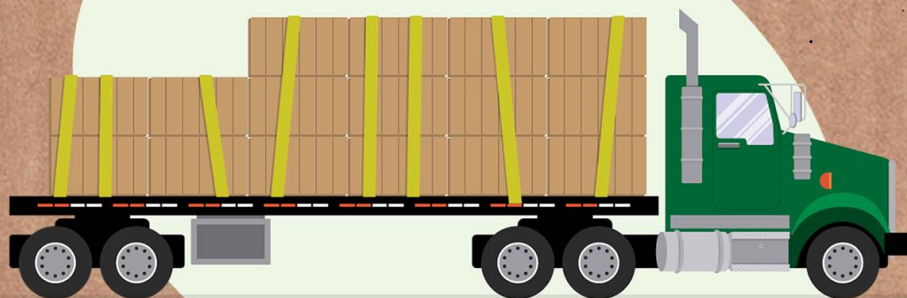
