





RWI is able to mitigate environmental contamination by controlling the dry aerosol drift commonly associated with higher horsepower evaporators. We designed our evaporators with critical velocity control to prevent the formation of daughter particles. By preventing the formation of daughter particles, we are not releasing pollutants into the air. This allows the water droplet to be specifically sized to not dry out in flight or lose control of contaminants. After the lon contamination is concentrated the droplet returns to the pond keeping the pollution within the impoundment area.

Casper is a major city in Wyoming and the County Seat of Natrona County. Casper is the second most populated city in the state, after the capital of Cheyenne. Casper is nicknamed "The Oil City" and has a long history of oil infrastructure and Western cowboy culture.

Casper is located in East Central Wyoming, on the North Platte River, and is a popular fishing destination for sportsmen around the West.

The city was established East of the former site of Fort Caspar and was a popular destination for settlers during the mid-19th century during periods of mass migration along the Oregon, California, and Mormon Trails.

Casper is home to several museums and historical sites: Fort Caspar Museum and Historic Site, National Historic Trails Interpretive Center, and many more.

The iconic Wyoming National Bank in downtown Casper is a mid-century tower designed by Carles Deaton, that is featured in Casper's Logo.

Hogadon Basin Ski Area is located atop Casper Mountain and is located 11 miles South of town. The ski area features 28 trails ranging from beginner to expert.

Transforming Closed Landfills and Impoundments into Renewable Energy Assets
